DUE: At the beginning of recitation – see recitation syllabus for specific dates.

Qualitative sociological research offers an understanding of hidden meanings and new phenomena through observational inquiry. Your journal entries act as a written conversation between you and the book. Hold up your end of the bargain: dig deep, be specific, and include detail!

## To prepare:

- 1. Choose a book from the list starting on the second page of this document.
- 2. Split up your book into chunks to last you the semester.
- 3. Read! I encourage you to take brief notes, highlight, and jot in the margins.

# Address and include the following in every journal entry:

- 1. **Summary:** Write coherently and succinctly about what you have read.
- 2. **Reaction:** Evaluate what in your reading that intrigues, impresses, amuses, shocks, puzzles, saddens, disturbs, repulses, or aggravates you.
- 3. **Sociological Connections:** Draw and expand upon *at least* 3 clear sociological connections between your book and concepts/theories learned since your last submission.

# For the first journal, include:

1. **Choice**: An exploration into the reasons behind your choice of monograph this semester. Work to move beyond "it's interesting" or "it's the shortest book"!

# For the last journal, include:

- 1. **Rating:** Give the book a rating out of five.
- 2. Goal: Include the author's main sociological goals of writing this book plus their supporting points.
- 3. **Method:** Describe the research design and sociological methods that are used throughout the book.
- 4. Strength & Weakness: Illustrate the book's greatest sociological strengths and weaknesses.
- 5. **Recommendation:** Explain who you would recommend this book to, and why.

# Don't forget:

- 1. Include full name, student number, and section. Use ASA style for citations
- 2. If submitting via D2L: 1-inch margins, 12-point Times New Roman font
- 3. If turning in via paper: College-ruled notebook paper or journal
